Award Categories 2018

Excellence in Clinical Practice Award

This award recognises the achievements of individual nurses and midwives in the delivery of patient care you consider exceptional and above the standard of nursing or midwifery practice.

- ✓ The pursuit of excellence in the nursing and midwifery professions is vital to ensure nursing and midwifery care that is effective, efficient and focused on patients and their individual health care needs
- ✓ Evidence of contribution to achieving National Targets and Key Performance Indicators is underpinned in the individual's practice

Nominations for this category will be judged on their ability to demonstrate or illustrate at least ONE of the following:

- An exceptional contribution by the nominee to improving care/outcomes for patients and/or evidence of contribution to achievement of the National Targets and Key Performance Indicators
- The delivery of a positive outcome in service provision or patient care in the face of adversity or other challenges
- An outstanding act of kindness, understanding, compassion or courage, above and beyond the nominee's role as a nurse or midwife

Services to Nursing or Midwifery Award

The award recognises the achievements of an individual nurse or midwife who has engaged and influenced nursing or midwifery practice within the wider service, organisation or profession.

- ✓ Advocacy for nursing or midwifery in this engagement/influence must be demonstrated

Nominations for this category will be judged on a nurse or midwife's engagement and influence that demonstrates advocacy for nursing or midwifery.

Services to Maori Nursing or Midwifery Award

The award recognises the achievements of an individual Maori nurse or midwife working within the HB Health Sector (e.g. primary, secondary, NGO etc.)

- ✓ Evidence of excellence in clinical and cultural practice
- ✓ Contribution to towards reducing disparities for Maori

Nominations for this category will identify as Maori, and will be judged on ability to demonstrate:

- How the individual has integrated clinical and cultural practice, and
- How the individual has contributed towards reducing disparities for Maori through the delivery of a service or program

Innovation and Support in a Practice Setting Award (e.g. leadership, quality)

This award acknowledges a nurse or midwife who has initiated innovative services or products that positively benefit patients/whanau or other nursing/midwifery staff, recognising the hard work and dedication.

- ✓ Being at the frontline of healthcare puts nurses and midwives in an ideal position to develop new or innovative solutions, to wide and varied issues experienced by their patients. This award recognises the spirit with which nurses and midwives embrace their profession and seek to deliver innovative care to patients

Nominations for this category will be judged on ability to demonstrate ALL of the following:

- The individual has initiated and/or developed a product, service or process themselves
- How the product, service or process has had a positive impact on patients/whanau
- How the product, service or process has been linked to HBDHB strategies and/or National Targets and Key Performance Indicators

Health Hawke's Bay Nursing Award

The award for an outstanding practice nurse that can demonstrate;

- ✓ Excellence in clinical practice and innovation for Practice Nursing in a Hawke's Bay primary care setting

Nominations for this category will be judged on their exceptional contribution to the patients and service delivery in a primary care setting.

Teamwork Award

The award for a nursing or midwifery TEAM that demonstrates:

- ✓ Excellence of service delivery/innovation and patient safety

Nominations for this category will be judged on their ability to demonstrate at least TWO of the following:

- Excellence
- Service Delivery
- Innovation
- Patient Safety

Maureen Bent Memorial Award

This award recognises the achievements of an individual nurse that demonstrates:

- ✓ Excellence in Clinical Practice for services to the Cardiac Unit HB Hospital

Nominations for this category will be judged on their exceptional contribution to the patients and service delivery from the Cardiac Unit (inpatient and outpatient).

Outstanding Contribution to Nursing or Midwifery Leadership

This award acknowledges a nurse or midwife who stands out for their clear vision and ambition, their drive to reach goals and an ability to inspire those around them. Leaders have a willingness to develop high performing teams and mentor and develop others. This award celebrates the contribution of leaders to their profession, the sector and our community.

Nominations for this category will be judged on their impact has on the Hawke's Bay health system:

- How have they made a difference to their workplace or profession?
- How have they affected health outcomes in Hawke's Bay?
- How has this leader influenced, inspired or impacted you?

Health Care Assistant Contribution to Clinical Practice Award

This award recognises the achievements of an individual health care assistant in the delivery of patient care you consider exceptional and above the standard of HCA practice.

- ✓ Evidence that HCA care that is effective, efficient and focused on patients and their individual health care needs
- ✓ Evidence of effective contribution to supporting the health care team in achieving relevant key performance indicators / targets as underpinned in the individual's practice

Nominations for this category will be judged on their ability to demonstrate or illustrate at least ONE of the following:

- The delivery of a positive outcome in service provision or patient care in the face of adversity or other challenges
- Effective contribution by the nominee to improving care/outcomes for patients and/or evidence of contribution to achievement of the key performance indicators / targets
- An outstanding act of kindness, understanding, compassion or courage, above and beyond the nominee's role as a HCA
