PURPOSE OF THE POSITION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To provide alcohol & drug and mental health assessment and treatment to those children and youth and their families, whose lives are affected by alcohol, drug use and mental health problems utilising a client centred harm minimisation approach. To provide a comprehensive and quality service that is accessible, appropriate and culturally sensitive, which will be accomplished in partnership with the individuals, families and communities, using current best practice which encourages people towards enhanced quality of life. To proactively participate, encourage and enhance service provision by providing an alcohol & other drug harm minimisation perspective and service as part of the wider multidisciplinary team. To promote and participate in multi-disciplinary team processes so as to ensure the best outcomes for clients.

Identifies issues relating to substance abuse, mental health and physical health alongside client's current health and disability issues. Complete a comprehensive addiction assessments in partnership with the client and their family/whanau addressing the bio-psycho-social-spiritual factors of the client including family relationships, history, cultural, religious, work history, legal and financial problems. Facilitate or co-facilitate individual or group interventions and other sessions as appropriate e.g. family / supporters / employers & or others sessions, that assess, plan, prepare, organise, debrief and support the person in their recovery, in accordance with a client centred harm minimisation approach. Develop strategies to respond to families/whanau, and /or communities needs for health education. Manage recovery coordination and any case work is safely, effectively and efficiently in consultation with relevant case team. Documentation of client records and statistics are maintained correctly and updated as required. Client confidentiality is maintained at all times to ensure the Privacy Act and Health Information Privacy Code 1994 and Code of Rights are adhered to. Demonstrates proficiency and autonomy of practice in the clinical setting providing interventions to service users with a range of needs. Utilising evidence based knowledge and skills through reflective practice and professional judgement to provide competent, interventions, support care and advice. Proactively anticipates and recognises cues to a situation and predicts outcomes, referring onto other clinical team members. Utilising assessment skills to assess service user responses to treatments and adapt approaches to accommodate any changes. Initiates interventions and monitors untoward effects, reactions, therapeutic responses, toxicity and incompatibilities related to interventions. Demonstrating responsibility, accountability and commitment in practice. Actively pursuing professional development opportunities. Participates in leadership in building and strengthening a therapeutic team. Keep abreast of developments in all aspects of the Addiction field and maintain an effective level of education and training in relevant areas.
